What are numbers?

Number talks are short daily routines that help students to develop strong number sense. As a result of these daily number talks, the students in KP have grown in their understanding of how numbers work, what they mean, and how they relate to one another and to the world around us.

Dot card talks are just one example of these short daily number routines and they are always a hit in KP! This routine involves students being given a quick glimpse of the dot card. They are then asked how many dots they saw and how they came up with that solution. Students use a wide variety of strategies such as subitisings (seeing groups of numbers without counting), doubles, friends of 10 skip-counting and known number combinations.

Below is an example of one of our recent dot talks and the clever solutions that the students in KP came up with.


"I know my doubles, so I could see quickly that 4 and 4 makes 8, plus 1 more makes 9." *Jack Weber*

"This is a 10 frame so if it was full it would have 10 dots. But there is 1 missing so 10 take-away 1 equals 9."
