## Putting the M in STEM

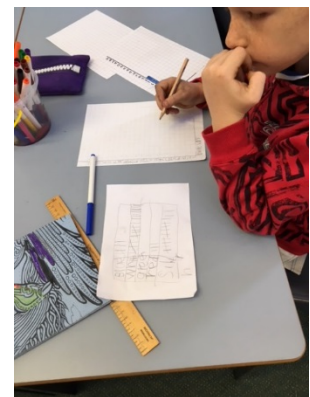
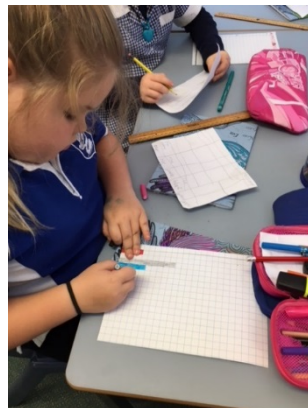
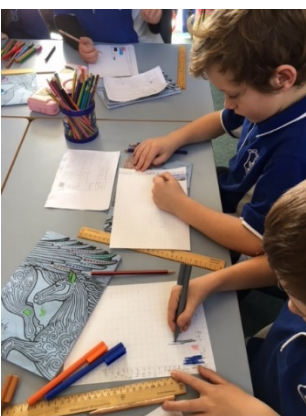
This week is STEM Week (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) and we will be using all our previously taught concepts to help complete a series of challenges. Concepts using number, measurement, shapes, data and statistics have all been covered and will be used to carry out 4 different tasks with a theme of energy. Using mathematical language in a real-life situation, within experiments, to create a finished product of a wind powered toy car, which is able to travel unassisted across a distance.

Early Action for Success has helped develop skills in which students can explain solutions and methods, explore mathematical problems and demonstrate how answers can be obtained.



Students in 2B have looked at measurement in metres. Ordering and measuring height, discussed results as well as distances from one part of the classroom to another in uniformed units and metres.

2B have also looked at area of two-dimensional shapes so we will be able to create wind sails to help move our vehicles.



Students have also graphed results from tallying cars drawing conclusions on which car colour is most popular. Using these skills they will be able to record results of distances travelled by a wind-powered vehicle and presenting their finding in graph form.

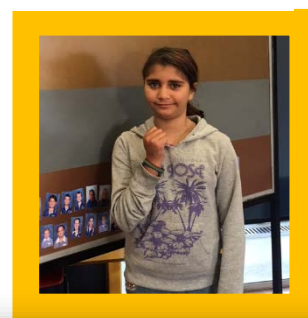
