INDIGENOUS JERSEY DESIGN COMPETITION

The Eden Tigers Committee and players would like to invite the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community to become a key part of the 2021 Indigenous Round celebrations by submitting a painting design for consideration for our Indigenous men's and ladies jerseys.

DESIGN BRIEF

- Submissions must capture the spirit and passion of Eden and/or the Eden Tigers, recognise and celebrate Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture in our community.
- You are to provide brief background on the design. It would be expected that a storyline would accompany the artwork, which explains all aspects of the design.
- Design must be authentic, an original work of the person submitting the design.
- All ages are encouraged to apply but entry is limited to one design per person.

DESIGN CONSIDERATIONS

The base colour of the Eden Tiger's jerseys will be white, so the painting must be able to be applied to a white background. You may also supply examples of the design applied onto a jersey.

PROCESS OF SELECTION

- Depending upon how many submissions are received, it will first go to a community vote for them to decide the top 10.
- Then a panel of representatives from the Tigers committee, Aboriginal community members and playing squad, will review ALL 10 submissions and select the winning design based on relevance to the design brief.
- The successful applicant will be decided no later than the end of February 2021.
