Playground Update

Canteen News

We are very fortunate to have a 5 day a week canteen to support our students with healthy food options. Currently, due to COVID restrictions students are only able to place orders at the canteen. We are hoping that as Department of Education restrictions ease in relation to cohort mixing of students, that the students will be able to purchase delicious items directly from the canteen shop front. Please continue to support our canteen during these difficult times.

Covid Update

Students must not attend school if unwell, even with mild symptoms of COVID-19. Any person with any COVID-19 symptoms must be sent home and not return to school unless:

- they have isolated for 10 days, when no medical certificate is available
- they have a negative COVID-19 test result and are symptom free.

In circumstances where children have other medical reasons for recurrent symptoms, a letter from their GP is sufficient to negate the requirement for a negative test.

Anyone who is unwell with COVID-19 symptoms is strongly encouraged to get tested and self-isolate until a negative result is received. Find your local <u>testing clinics</u>.

Mask Wearing for staff and students

- Masks or face coverings are <u>recommended</u> for:
 - indoor and outdoor settings for primary students (unless eating or exercising).
- It is also mandatory for all staff and students to carry a mask with them at all times in playgrounds and on school grounds. • Staff are required to wear masks in all indoor and outdoor settings.

Parents and visitors

• Non-essential visitors are not permitted in schools.

Parents are asked to;

- maintain physical distancing by avoiding gathering outside of school gates
- remain outside of school grounds (note some exceptions may apply regarding schools for specific purposes, vulnerable students or students with disability)
- follow mask-wearing requirements and sign in using the Service NSW QR code when entering the school.

Tell Them From Me student feedback survey (Term 4, 2021)

I am delighted that this term, our school, like many other public schools in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the *Tell Them From Me* student feedback survey. The survey measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

The survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. More than 6,300 schools in Australia and around the world have used *Tell Them From Me* to survey 5.4 million students. Capturing the voices of our students will help improve how we do things at our school.

I want to assure you that the survey is confidential. The survey is conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours between 18th October to 19th November. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary.
