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🌣 The students then designed their toy with labelled diagrams and as much detail as 🕁 possible. Here are some of their wonderful, finished products...












Hello Parents and Carers.

In term 3, EPS will be coordinating our school's Jump Rope for Heart program...and we need your help to make it a success.

Jump Rope for Heart is one of Australia's best loved physical activity and fundraising programs. It's designed to get students skipping to good health, while raising funds to help the Heart Foundation fight heart disease.

That's important because:

- one in four 5-12-year-old are either overweight or obese
- 80% of students are not getting the recommended amount of daily physical activity
- physical activity makes you less likely to have a heart attack and can help prevent and manage over 20 chronic diseases including some cancers, type 2 diabetes and depression
- Heart disease is Australia's biggest killer

The program will be most successful if you can help:

- promote Jump Rope for Heart
- get students skipping
- encourage them to sign up to fundraise online.

Once students are signed up online, fundraising takes care of itself. There's no cash handling, so everyone can concentrate on skipping. Students will also receive important updates and useful information direct from the Heart Foundation.




At the age of two, Isla had open-heart surgery to treat an atrial septal defect (ASD), which means she was born with a hole in the wall, or septum, that separates the top two chambers of the heart. Thankfully, Isla's story has a happy

ending. The surgery was a success, and her condition does not affect her day-to-day life.

> When Isla learned her school was doing Jump Rope for Heart, she felt a real connection to the cause.

'Mum, I can't go in the school talent show, because I don't have a talent. But this is skipping. I can do that and also help other kids like me'.

Isla registered for the program and not only improved her skipping skills, she finished the program as Carramar Primary School's highest fundraiser!



How your donations can help

For over 40 years, families like yours have helped make innovative research and future medical breakthroughs possible.



\$50 could cover the cost of basic tools like syringes and test tubes that researchers can use to grow heart cells in the lab.



\$100 could pay for a DNA test to identify people at high genetic risk of heart disease.



\$500 could cover the cost of research antibodies used to detect viral or bacterial infections in the heart.

Go4Fun improves health, fitness, self-esteem and confidence in children who are above a healthy weight.


Go4Fun runs for 10 weeks over the school term for children their families. Sessions include games, activities, tips on healthy food, label reading, portion sizes and much more!
