Learning in 5/6H

5/6H have been studying the Antarctic environment and the adaptations animal and plants need to survive the harsh climate. Using this information, we are creating and designing a new Antarctic animal. Students then use Tinkercad to print on the 3D printer, or modelling clay to bring their designs to life.







We have been reading the book One Small Island by Alison Lester and Coral Tulloch, that tells the history of Macquarie Island. The historical recounts in the book have inspired our writing and artwork.





In Maths we have been looking at the relationship between multiplication and division, and shapes that have rotational symmetry.

We have been collecting data on the temperature, wind direction and speed from the Australian Antarctic Research bases; Casey, Mawson, Davis and Macquarie Island. We are learning to interpret and graph the data.


