Principal's Message

Security fence

You may have noticed that our school security fence is now operational. Thank you for your patience throughout the installation process. The following are key points regarding procedures to be aware of:

- The gates will be locked during school hours between 9.15am to 2.45pm. To access the school site, visitors will need to press the intercom button on the gate and wait for our office staff to release the gate lock. You may need to identify yourself through the intercom. Once you are onsite you will need to attend the front office to sign in. This is a requirement to be on any school site.
- When you leave the school, you will need to press the intercom button again and the gates will be remotely opened by our office staff.
- It is important that families make appropriate arrangements to ensure that students are not dropped off at school before 8.30am as there is no direct supervision offered before this time. The gates will be opened in preparation for our students to arrive at school at 8.30am.
- Parents and students are NOT to use the carparks to access the school site for safety reasons.
- The service road on Calle Calle street will be locked throughout the day. At the end of the school day, students who exit the back gate will be supervised by teachers through the service gate. This gate will be opened to provide community access for special events, including school assemblies.
- Pedestrian gates will be opened at 2.45pm in preparation for the end of day procedures.






SCHOOL UNIFORM NEWS!






